

Air connections: Our region, in the way to establish direct air connections with eight major European cities:


<u>London, Paris, Düsseldorf, Brussels, Rome, Amsterdam, Lisbon, and Milano</u>.

SITE SELECTION



The Central Area of Asturias is a territory with the singularity of having three medium-sized cities, Gijón, Oviedo, and Avilés, within 25 km of each other and with a travel time of less than 30 minutes as they are connected by motorway.

This Central Area, with adjacent municipalities, **has around 800,000 inhabitants** (85% of the total of the region). It is, therefore, a polycentric area, being the seventh in Spain in terms of population.
