Founded in 2007, Windar Renovables manufactures on and offshore towers, as well as other substructures. It has ten production plants serving five continents and currently employs 1.5 thousand people.

The Government of Asturias assigns 3.4 M € to the creation and consolidation of R&D&I centres in large companies

The aim is to encourage large companies to create new R&D centres. Between 2020 and 2022, ten of these centres were set up in Asturias. The companies PMG, Windar Renovables, Gonvarri, Idesa, Satec, Linter (Samoa Group), Alsa, Aleastur, GAM and Duro Felguera joined the existing ones of ArcelorMittal and TK Elevator.

Turnover of 5.07 million euros for CTIC Centro Tecnológico in 2022, 12% more than in 2021

The Technology Centre for Information and Telecommunications has accumulated three years of growth and expects to reach 6 million in revenue and 80 jobs at its Gijón and Peón sites this year.

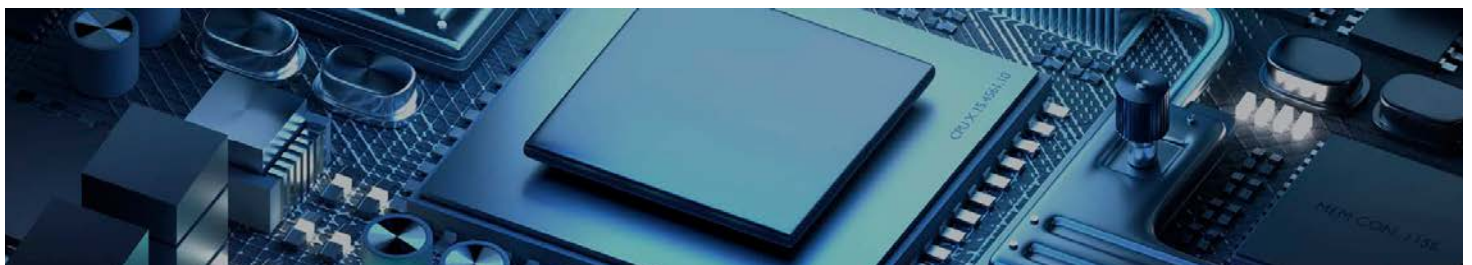

Exports | Asturian companies sold products and services abroad for a value of 1,694.7 million euros during the first quarter of this year, 26.6% more than in the same period of 2022. Germany leads the ranking of export destinations.



Defence | The defence industry in Asturias, in perfect shape to take on new programmes. The arms-related industry currently involves 24 companies in our region, with a turnover of 140 million euros and generating more than 500 direct jobs.
